They need enough to meet their family's needs, for things such as drinking water and to water crops for food – but of course, they meet obstacles along the way! A real opportunity to consider how others live around the world – and what we can do to help.



Henry Woodhouse, a Hallam Seminarian currently studying at Oscott, joined our Year 6 class who are studying the Come and See topic of 'Called, Vocation and Ordination'. He talked to them about his mission and his journey to the seminary.
